**The Chinese policemen's participation in the deadly raids against residents of Bel-Air is reportedly part of the struggle of continental China to oust Taiwan's influence in Haiti**

**Port-au-Prince, June 7, 2005 (AHP)-** The participation of Chinese policemen in the deadly raids against residents of Bel-Air is reportedly part of a fight by Continental China to oust Taiwan's influence in Haiti, a diplomatic source in Port-au-Prince pointed out to AHP Tuesday.

25 persons were killed and over a dozen houses set on fire during those operations. Bel-Air residents accuse the Chinese of opening fire together with national police contingents on members of the civil population in order to push them to leave their district in the perspective of the elections announced for this year. The Chinese reportedly also used blunt instruments and participated in the fire of their houses, they declared.

The same diplomatic source also declared that the Chinese allegedly accepted to do this job because of the fact that Latin-Americans, who are the main group in the UN mission, would be more inclined to go with the recent declarations made by military commandant, Brazilian General Augusto Heleno Ribeiro. He had declared Friday that he would never order a massacre in populist districts because there was no prescription for this type of crime.

According to the same source, the Chinese policemen who were in action Saturday are allegedly cast in the same mould as those who participated to the Pekin deadly repression against students at Tien A Men Square.

Minister of Justice Bernard Gousse had declared Friday that foreign swats were now in the country to reinforce the national Swat Team. He had refused to say where those elements were from, or what legal framework defined their presence in the country.

**The CARLI writes a report on crimes and reprehensible acts committed in May**
