
Unionist and socio-professional organizations intensify their movement against the interim regime who is accused of doing nothing for underprivileged classes

Port-au-Prince, June 10, 2005 (AHP)- Several unionist and socio-professional organizations including the Platform of Haitian Human Rights Organizations (POHDH), the National Union of Haitian Teachers-in-Training (UNNOH), Kay Fanm, MEGA and SOFA, organized this Friday a new sit-in before the office of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, to continue to demand that prices of oil products go down.

Participants chanted words hostile to provisional authorities to show their frustrations in regards to their attitude considered irresponsible as they refuse to satisfy the population's demands notably regarding the cost of life and insecurity.

The people organizing this sit-in had taken active part in the GNB- anti-Aristide movement, and they declared that they were disappointed with the interim authorities' behaviour as they worked together with elements from the wealthy class to make the population suffer.

Camille Charlmers from PAPDA, Jean Junior Wilson from MEGA and Olga Benoît from SOFA, congratulated themselves of the fact that there were many more organizations this Friday before the office of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, to continue to demand that prices of oil products go down.

"Prices of oil products must go down, they declared. Camille Chalmers, Jean Junior Wilson and Olga Benoît assured that the population will remain mobilized through different activities to force interim authorities to assume their responsibilities. Interim authorities pay attention to their leaders' orders, but pretend not to hear the population's demands, they denounced.
