Dr. Phuoc Le, a graduate of the Stanford School of Medicine and the UC Berkeley School of Public Health, is a Global Health Equity resident with expertise in community-based research, health disparities and interventions in developing countries. He has spent much of the past three months in Haiti, leading PIH's medical transfers and medical volunteer coordination activities. He will be visiting the Bay Area immediately upon his return to the United States and will be speaking about his experiences in Haiti as well as PIH's longer term plans for recovery and rebuilding.

Partners In Health (PIH) has been working in Haiti for over 20 years to address the joint burdens of poverty and disease. Together with its Haitian sister organization, Zanmi Lasante, PIH was among the first to mobilize relief services following the January 12th earthquake. Following the acute phase of response, PIH has embarked on long-term plans for rebuilding lives and livelihoods, communities, and the public health system.
