Many of our supporters have responded to Haiti's earthquake by writing letters, calling their representatives, donating generously both their time and their money, and offering emotional support. Nicole Phillips, a long-time IJDH collaborator, quit her law firm job to volunteer for us full time and we have five more lawyers planning to do the same in September. Chris Eves and Samantha Diamond, volunteer interns, are spending their summers in Haiti working to develop our technological capacity. Colleen McLaughlin, who heard about IJDH in February, emailed us asking how she could help. By June, she had raised several thousand dollars, donated dozens of hours in development consulting and traveled to Haiti on a delegation working with women's groups to plan collective action to gender-based violence in the camps. Alexa Lehman, introduced to us by Colleen, has volunteered her nights and weekends to help us increase our visibility and use of social media for the next three months. **Read more about our <u>donors</u> and <u>volunteers</u> by following these links.**

We are profoundly grateful for this generosity. It not only has allowed us to increase the legal services we provide to people in great need, it helps us take advantage of unique opportunities to use legal intervention now to make enduring changes that will build a more just Haiti less vulnerable to natural and man-made disasters.

But every day we are faced with even more unmet legal needs: women raped in the displacement camps, families evicted from

We have a system that successfully delivers justice for Haiti's poorest, but we need to hire more lawyers to expand the system to meet the expanded needs and opportunities generated by the earthquake.

In short, we need to double our legal staff this year to meet the challenges of Haiti's earthquake. This week, we are, therefore, asking our supporters to consider doubling their previous financial support to help us reach this goal. We know this is asking a lot, that times are still tough, and that many of our supporters have already contributed to other Haiti causes. But we promise to work harder than ever to make sure our donors' generosity is translated into a more just society for Haiti's poor.
