Dr. Ramona Tascoe, MD, has led medical missions to Kenya, Tanzania, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Angola, India, Sri Lanka, and Haiti, where she coordinated the work of U.S. doctors and nurses providing medical relief in Haiti's largest public hospital.

Andrew Macculla, Direct Relief International Haiti Program Operations Specialist, has worked since the earthquake to oversee the distribution of over \$50 million worth of medications and is currently working to implement a new program to improve maternal and child health in Haiti.

Dr. Sriram Shamasunder, MD, Assistant Clinical Professor UCSF Department of Medicine works with Partners in Health and led a group of Harvard surgeons in Western Haiti, to provide medical and surgical care immediately after the earthquake.

Nicole Phillips, JD, Adjunct Professor at The University of San Francisco, School of Law, is an attorney at the Institute for Justice & Democracy in Haiti and assistant director for Haiti programs at USF's Center for Law and Global Justice. Phillips serves on the Human Rights Advocates Board of Directors and has appeared before various U.N. committees including U.N. Human Rights Committee and U.N. Commission on the Status of Women.
