

THE BRING BABY DOC TO JUSTICE CAMPAIGN

Since former Haitian Dictator Jean-Claude Duvalier unexpectedly returned to Haiti in January, 2011 the Institute for Justice & Democracy in Haiti (IJDH) and our Haitian affiliate the Bureau des Avocats Internationaux (BAI) have been assisting the Haitian government to prosecute Duvalier for political and financial crimes.

- In the commission of his crimes, Duvalier used the vast government and paramilitary network under his control. In court, it will be a challenge to present evidence of the scope, structure and hierarchy of this network in a persuasive and compelling manner.
- However, investing in the use of leading technology to create **interactive timelines and exhibitions** will allow IJDH and the BAI to:
 - Effectively illustrate the extent of Duvalier's control and the scale of his crimes;
 - Build capacity in the Haitian judiciary through increasingly professional trial proceedings;
 - Support equal protection of law by providing Haitian victims with the same legal tools available to clients in the United States.
