Dear Mr. President,

It is with sadness that I write this letter, to remind you that human rights are rights that all people must respect.

My name is Louis Louisius. I live in the Mirebalais commune. While I was in Jaoun, I brought some water to drink. Once I finished drinking it I had a stomachache. After a short time I started to vomit and after that diarrhea took over my body; I became dizzy, and I fainted in the garden. They came to get me on a stretcher to take me to the hospital, when I came back to consciousness, I saw that I was laying on a hospital bed that had a hole in it. It wasn't until after that the doctor told me I had cholera. Ever since I was diagnosed with cholera, I have had back pain, and cramps in my feet when I sit. I can't stand and I have family to take care of. They tell me MINUSTAH brought this illness to my country, for that reason I am asking for justice and reparations.

I hope that my demands are of utmost importance to you.
