Objective: Demand Justice and Reparations

It is with sadness that I write this short letter to remind you that the laws of humanity are something every person must respect.

My name is Louis Olice. I live in the Mirebalais communal district. In 2011, the cholera sickness came to me. It came with a very sick stomach, extreme vomiting and diarrhea. I lost consciousness and they had to carry me. Where I live it is very far so they rented a motorcycle to take me to the hospital.

When I arrived at the hospital the doctor rushed to put me on an IV because I was not myself. When I came to myself I saw the doctor put me on a bed with a hole for my diarrhea and a bucket for my vomit. I felt weak and like I would fall to the ground. It was the first time I had been in such pain.

After I left the hospital, I went home. I had to rest and could not take care of my house and family and we did not have food. My brother has to help me because I cannot work. My kids cannot go to school, because I do not have the money to pay.

My friend, life is finished for me.

Oh, MINUSTAH, you bring misfortune to my country. I am asking for justice and reparations.

I still believe the authorities of the United Nations will respond to the people.
